Celebrating our Curriculum





Science:

Some year 7 students have completed a flower dissection this week to investigate the reproductive parts of flowers. They were able to identify the style, anther, and stigma found inside the flower, and were able to extract some pollen from the anther. Questions to ask your child about plant reproduction (**and answers in bold**):

- 1. Why are petals often brightly coloured? (To attract animals such as bees)
- 2. What part of the flower contains the pollen cells? (The anther)
- 3. What part of the flower does the pollen cell land on during pollination? (The stigma)
- 4. What part of the flower contains the ovule? (The ovary)

Throughout the day, students participated in a range of exciting activities. A big congratulations to all the students who completed the quiz!
