Message from the Head of School

I would first like to let you know of some important changes to the structure of the school day that will take effect from September.

After careful consideration and planning, we have decided to amend the times of the school day to ensure that our students can study topics in greater depth. This change involves extending the duration of each lesson. However, to accommodate this while maintaining a balanced school day, we will reduce the total number of subject-based lessons per day. Our new timetable will run over two weeks to ensure a broad coverage of all of our subject areas.

Starting in September, the new schedule will be as follows:

- Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday: There will be five subject-based learning sessions each day.
- Wednesday and Friday: There will be four subject-based learning sessions each day.

In addition to this, we will have our usual morning meeting and advisory schedule.

The start time of the school day will remain unchanged at 8.15am. On Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday, Key Stage 3 students will finish school at 3.05pm and Key Stage 4 at 3.15pm. On Wednesday and Friday, the school day will end at 2.10pm for Years 8, 10 and 11 and at 2.15pm for Years 7 and 9.

We believe that this adjustment will provide our students with a more focused and enriched learning experience, allowing them to engage more deeply with the curriculum. We are committed to ensuring that these changes benefit our student's educational journey and overall well-being.

Please feel free to contact the school office if you have any questions or concerns regarding this new schedule. We appreciate your support and understanding as we strive to enhance the quality of education we provide.

Students said that although it was a bit scary, they feel they benefitted from such an experience and know it will be useful when they face real interviews in the future.
