We hope to resolve the matter as soon as possible but please bear with us while we investigate. Please top up their accounts as you normally would as money will continue to be debited. Lunches will be provided to all students even if there is not enough money on their account, however this will not extend to snacks at breaktime.

Thank you for your patience and we will keep you informed of when the fingerprint system is working again.

Year 7 have been practicing their science skills since starting with us - this has included carefully measuring the volume of different liquids...








